

Childcare 2019/20







Do you already work in childcare and want to progress in your role, or are you interested in working with young children? Then we have courses for you......

Is it for me?

These qualifications are suitable for anyone who wants a career in childcare or an introduction to the Teaching Assistant role. For level 2 and 3 qualifications you will need to be employed or a volunteer in a nursery, preschool or work as a childminder, foster carer, in youth and community or in care (children).

What are the requirements?

- For a **Level 1** course you do not need a placement or a job in childcare
- For a **Level 2** course you need to be working in an establishment caring for babies and children from 0-5 years. You can be **either employed or working on a voluntarily basis** for a minimum of 9 hours per week which will be confirmed with your employer / placement.
- For a **Level 3 Early Years Educator** course you must be **employed** within a childcare setting for a minimum of 2 full days a week or equivalent i.e. 12-15 hours a week.
- You will also complete an assessment to identify your English and Maths levels and attend an Initial Assessment meeting with a teacher.
- To enrol for a Level 1 course you must be working at Functional Skills Level E3 in English
- To enrol for a Level 2 course you must be working at Functional Skills Level 1 in English
- To enrol for a Level 3 course you must be working at Functional Skills Level 2 in both English and Maths and have completed a level 2 course.

Courses offered

Introduction to Childcare

You will gain an overview of working in a childcare / learning environment. You will look at how to provide for children's physical needs through activities, creativity and music.

Level 1 Award in Caring for Children

This qualification provides an introduction to caring for children and helps develop the skills and knowledge you need to care for children. You will be introduced to a wide range of topics including child development, engaging children through activities and personal development.

Level 2 Certificate for Children and Young People's Workforce

This qualification is for those who work, or are about to work, as a nursery assistant, crèche worker or special educational needs assistant in a supporting role. You want to work with children, but you'll generally work under supervision. Topics covered include understanding child and young person development, communication, safeguarding, health and safety, assessment and planning. This is a work-based qualification and you will be assessed whilst working with children, young people, their families and colleagues.

Level 3 Diploma for the Early Years Practitioner (EYE)

This two year course is the recognised qualification for learners wanting to work as Early Years Educators in England. Learners on this course will be required to demonstrate an in-depth understanding of early years education and care, including that they can support and promote children's early education and development, plan and provide effective care enabling children to progress, make accurate and productive use of assessment, develop effective and informed practice, safeguard and promote the health, safety and welfare of children, work in partnership with the key person, colleagues, parents and/or carers or other professionals.

Progression

Introduction to Childcare is an ideal taster to see if working with children is for you; you can then progress onto a Level 1 Award or Level 2 Certificate.

Once you've completed the Level 1 Award, you could advance to the Level 2 Certificate for the Children and Young People's Workforce.

Level 2 achievement can help you find work as a Nursery Nurse or Childminder and there are opportunities to progress to Level 3 Diploma for the Early Years Practitioner (EYE),.

Successful completion of a Level 3 qualification could lead to progression within employment in a variety of roles, or moving onto Higher Education .

Course Information

How is the qualification delivered and assessed?

During our courses you will build a portfolio or e-portfolio of work where you will demonstrate your ability and knowledge. If using an e-portfolio, we will set up your account and develop your skills in using it effectively. Timetabled sessions are held during term time and will include workshops, taught sessions, tutorials. For levels 2 and 3 your teacher/assessor will arrange to visit your workplace to observe you in practice. All portfolios **must** be **completed** by the date agreed with your assessor. The course content will be planned individually to suit your level, experience and working environment.
